They got shirts for the players and will have a resource table event prior to the game. Goodridge school had 20 people attend safe TALK training. TRF school also had a safe talk training and then has also held several trainings in Roseau County. They are looking at piloting an ongoing training or support for the trainees moving forward. New providers coming on board at Sanford. Alluma- SAMSHA grant will be done October 1 <sup>st</sup> . They are having biweekly meetings- They have hired a care coordinator at corrections- Crisis screenings in the jails. Med management program is strong. They continue to have their community response meetings with Polk County and Norman County is next on their list to start the conversations. LifeCare- no one present Ucare- They have hired a significant number of care coordinators in the last year- they want to make sure their	All

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Adiaum		clients are getting the care they need. Are they getting the services they need in the right place at the right time. Working not only internally, but with external teams as well. <b>BCBS</b> - Beth will be bringing electronic pets next time she attends in person. Available to MSHO to reduce socialization. They have a dog, bird and cat. <b>NWTRCC</b> - Emphasize the need for transportation dollars in our region. <b>WITW</b> - They have a virtual WRAP class coming up in January. Dawn sent Shannon the flyer to send out to the group. They opened up to other regions. This class is open to all ages up to 15 people per class. WITW offers a warmline from 5pm- 9am. <b>Medica-</b> With their expansions this year- they will be expanding their community-based program and will have a list of the providers they will be working with in our area when she comes in March. This is a 6-month program. Case managers can meet with your patients weekly, biweekly, etc. Whatever is needed. This is meant to be help support, not duplicate. <b>Social Services:</b> <b>Norman County</b> Law enforcement may need some extra support if Alluma or Sanford could reach out to help support them during this time- as they just lost their sheriff. Just had a disability worker retire and are working on filling that position. They have an adult Social work position posted- lack of CCBHC beds available has been a struggle. <b>Red Lake County-</b> They are struggling getting their clients Mental Health Services which causes them to struggle at the county level. <b>Polk County-</b> Nothing <b>Roseau-</b> Busy- Child protection has skyrocketed since Jan 2 <sup>nd</sup> . Regionally they see low numbers- so this increase is seeming more significant. <b>Pennington-</b> Construction project has been bid out- possibly this summer they should be in the new building. She as retirements and openings mainly in adult services. <b>Kittson-</b> no new updates
