One of the biggest hurdles- we are not seeing as many volunteer drivers and after hours, Holidays and weekends are a big issue when trying to find transportation. Kathy- Zoom meetings and telehealth services have helped eliminate some of the transportation issues. Kristi- good approach would be to reach out to hospitals and clinics to see if they can coordinate follow up appointments with the bussing schedule for each of the counties. Shauna- are there clients that are well enough in their recovery that could help with transportation? Chris- where are we going to get the funding to pay for these people? They are only paid mileage. Also, some people don't want to stick around for hours to wait for others. Issues we are seeing: payment, liability, wait time and volume of people transporting is limited. Kristi- DHS and MNDOT need to adjust the payment eligibility for the rural area. Chris- if you can find volunteers, please have them sign up- we are down to 12 drivers. Overall- policy changes need to be made in order for any transporting gaps to be eliminate. Beth- It would help to invite health plans to your regional meeting, especially MA. Beth also shared with Lynell that she would be w

NL- IRTS beds are full, both Crisis beds open. Kathy- Are these new people you are seeing? Miranda- Some are new people that are waiting too long to seek services and some are clients we haven't seen in years. The kids they are seeing lately have been tough. The acuity of the children they are seeing is concerning (ages 12-16 with suicidal attempts & ideation plans) Adults- psychosis/manic behavior. NWMHC- Crisis team has been working with the homeless team to help with housing during this time. Uptick in volume for Crisis- they have a new reporting system for their phones and will be able to capture volume of calls that are coming into the Crisis line. Struggling trying to hire children providers. Tracking the Tele med Bill that is being brought forward in legislation. (Will Telephone stay included) With lack of bandwidth in our area, being able to provide services by phone has been lifesaving. Down 2 Psychiatric providers. Amber Deere moved to Kittson and Barb Norman retired. Part-time prescriber joined, but will not be able to start until this summer. They are not taking on new clients. 2 new executive positions have started. In final stages of rebranding project- identified new name, but have not publicly announced it yet. Lifecare-Staffing is always a challenge- they are managing to keep their head above water. They are utilizing casual staff on weekends to help with the elimination of staff. There is a new clinical supervisor up in Kittson and they are looking at working with her. Transportation meeting- meets every six months- LE, Sanford, SS, AMHI Coordinator, - started with transport- but have utilized this group to improve processes.
