Once the project is complete, they will have two safe rooms in their ED. They are equipped like their inpatient rooms but are in the ER. They are losing a Psychologist in September- they added their Psych NP on to their On Call rotation. Dr Arterman is no longer here. They did redistribute his clients to others. There is not an actual suboxone clinic in TRF, but there is a provider that has taken over for the time being. NL is low census for IRTS, long waiting list for therapy. Alluma- NWA 11 out of 12 beds filled. Foster care is the same. SAMSHA grant ends September 30th. Waitlist- Outpatient 156, School, 68, peer 7 Family therapy is 31. There is a workgroup working around how they can add flexibility around practitioners providing more independent work For everyone part of the NW council of collaboratives family partners for peers the child used to have to be tied to CTSS, now they just need to have a MH dx. Shauna attended the office of broadband development. The State will be receiving funding in 2024- they are looking at offering grants to counties, providers, schools, etc. to connect people with the resources, tools, and skills. Broadband funding Tammy- CFO is retiring the end of this year. Racheal Kangesier will move into her role. Ucare- They participated in the Mental Health Day at the State Fair. They are also participating in the NAMI walk on September 23rd. They are in the process of interviewing for Housing specialist and a liaison counterpart to Leon. They are adding Peer support for an added benefit starting in January 2024. LifeCare- Paula Hedlund is the new supervisor. They have a speaking engagement in October. Will have a second NP up and running by early next year. Medica BH- when you call into care advocacy center they are all independently licensed and are able to assist someone if they are in a crisis. They also have it embedded in their software to pull up local cr	All
