Bridges	NW8 AMHI Bridges fund update	Bridge funds were utilized more than anticipated last year. All but Kittson County accessed funds and were able to serve a great number of people. We have already received almost \$10,000 in funding requests this year and are afraid of funding depleting early in the year. Crisis housing funds that normally helped with housing assistance has not been accessible. The State is working with a new vendor, but at this point in time they are not sure when they will be able to utilize the funding.  Do we keep the maximum per household at \$1000 or do we consider lowering it? Yes- keep at \$1000, spend as is and hopefully with the surplus there will be back fill to assist in this area.  Would we ever want to consider allowing a higher maximum for anyone requesting funds that normally would have been paid by Crisis Housing Funds until the Crisis Housing Funds become available again? No- there are other funds out there they can utilize through SS.  In the past and thus far this year, only requests where the individuals would be able to maintain thereafter have been allowed; however last year, we allowed situations where it wasn't always clear that the individual would be able to maintain thereafter. Do we continue to stick with funding situations where the individuals will be able to maintain or do we open it up to assisting individuals where it may be less certain if they will be able to maintain? NWA will potentially having a few opening coming up.  Sanford- Closed down BH unit. Most all of their services are back up and operating besides IP BH. Dialysis is up and running as of yesterday. There are some providers in house all the time, some hybrid, and the rest virtual. They are on target for opening beginning of April. IP unit- only 4 patients a day until full capacity. Once she has a for sure go live date, she will let the group know. No counselor hired yet at SUD building. Psych and Psychology can see any patients in any ED location when needed.  LifeCare- Not present  CBHH- Not present  Ucare- Reiterate they have been successful in hiring care managers. Looking at housing, food, employment, mental health, medical, med management, scheduling appts, etc. for their	

		members and be a resource for providers. If you are at capacity and you have identified they need case management services we can be there to assist you. They are working on hiring a housing specialist. Not sure what that is going to look like yet. Leon will be representing Ucare at Be the Voice in Warroad on April 26th. BCBS- Red Carpet event in Crookston on May 14th. Diversity applications- looking at funding 10 grants in Greater MN. LAC- Recruited a new member for Roseau County. They have been planning and preparing for the event. Putting together activity table.  NWRTCC- Not present WITW- Not present Medica BH- Looking forward to additional growth and expansion.  Norman County SS- hired full time eligibility worker that started on Monday. Nancy is officially the Director at Norman County.
